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SANTORINI - 15-16 September 2002

FIRA

Fira, or Thira, is the main town on Santorini. Most of the streets do not allow cars. Worth checking out :

New Arcaelological Museum (Contains Akrotiri frescoes, thought to be from Atlantis)
near Fira central square

AKROTIRI

“Akrotiri, sometimes called ‘the Pompeii of the Aegean,’ is breathtaking. With just three percent of the site uncovered, you can walk through streets with whole houses as high as three stories, containing stacks of exquisite pottery and whose walls are decorated with delicate, brilliantly colored frescoes. The people of Akrotiri remain a mystery. No skeletons have been found, nor anything of value except for one small golden bull.” G.Y. Dryansky, Conde Nast Traveler, July 2002.

Open: 8:30-19:00, closed Monday. Avoid the first two hours, which are for groups.

OIA

Also know as Ia has stunning views. Caters to the high-end tourists.

GETTING AROUND

Buses run every half hour or so between Fira and the main towns. Taxis are fairly cheap and the hotel can call one for you (you will have to walk to it, since the hotel is not accessible by car). Another option is to rent a car and drive around at your own leisure (Hertz in Fira, T:22469; Budget, T:22900)

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SANTORINI - 15-16 September 2002

OF NOTE

1. Santorini's troglodytic dwellings (caved-in homes) hanging off the steep cliffs
2. Its black sand beaches (lava from the volcano blast that gave the island its distinctive landscape)
3. Santorini is the leading white wine producer in Greece. The Boutaris cellars, in Megalohori, is one of the main producers and offers wine tastings and a film show (T: 81607; Open 13:00-18:00).
4. You can take a caique tour of the caldera, landing at Nea Kameni. By foot, you can walk up to the crater of the volcano.
5. In Fira, take a stroll along Agios Minas where cafes and restaurants overlook the precipice.

SHOPPING -- Shops are usually open 9:00-20:00, 7 days a week.

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MIKONOS - 17-19 September 2002

MIKONOS TOWN

Within walking distance of the hotel is Mikonos Town, where you'll find the shopping and nightlife. Also worth checking out is the Folk Museum (on the harbourfront. T:22591. Open Monday-Saturday.) containing a collection of ceramics, embroidery and textiles. On the other side of the waterfront is the Archaeological Museum (T:22325. Open Tuesday-Sunday) which houses ancient Roman and Hellenistic carvings, ceramics, jewellery and gravestones.

LITTLE VENICE (ALEFKANDRA)

Houses built on the water, where artists live and work. Little Venice is situated below Kastro, the oldest part of the town.

BEACHES

Paradise or Super Paradise (note these are gay and nude)

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MIKONOS - 17-19 September 2002

DELOS

Ferries depart from Mikonos Town to this archaeological site. Ruins date back to 700BC when Delos was a major religious center. By 300BC, it had developed into a commercial port. Open 8:30-15:00 Tuesday-Sunday.

GETTING AROUND

Buses to Paradise run from the station by the Olympic Airways office. You can also rent a moped or car in the southwestern part of town (Euro Club: 23791) or have the hotel call you a taxi.

SHOPPING

Odos Andronikou and Odos Enoplou Dinameon is for high-end watch, jewellery and boutique shopping.

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USEFUL GREEK -- Food

Souvlakia -- pork skewers grilled with lemon, herbs, garlic and olive oil.

Tzatziki -- yoghurt mixed with cucumber, garlic and mint.

Mezes -- appetizers or first course

Elies -- Olives

Melitzanosalata -- grilled eggplant and herbs, pureed.

Revithosalata -- pureed chickpeas, coriander and garlic

Ntolmades -- currants, pine nuts and rice wrapped in vine leaves

Melitzanes imam baildi -- eggplant filled with a ragout of onions, tomatoes and herbs

Keftedes -- minced pork or beef balls fried with egg, breadcrumbs, herbs, mint and cumin.

Giaourti kai meli -- yoghurt with honey

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
